<p>貳、計畫實施成果摘述 500 字</p>	
<p>世界和平婦女會 (WFWPI) 於 2025 年 3 月 8 日至 9 日，在紐約舉辦聯合國倡議培訓，主題為「透過教育、倡議與賦權，裝備女性與女孩投入和平建設與夥伴關係」。來自全球北美、亞非歐洲及加勒比海地區 17 個國家 60 位與會者參加，透過課程、分組討論及經驗交流，協助 WFWPI 領導人具備倡議必要知識技能，以促進社會與制度層面的變革與有影響力的合作夥伴關係。</p> <p>培訓聚焦《北京行動綱領》與 SDGs 落實與在地化，探討如何在社會與制度面推動性別平等與女性賦權，建立與聯合國及各國政府的報告機制。與會者學習倡議實務、性別政策以及如何促進女性在健康、教育、領導力等全面發展。會中呼應聯合國婦女署強調的性別平等投資方向。</p> <p>WFWP 為具 UN ECOSOC 最高諮詢地位的 NGO，致力於建立女性領導力傳承平台，由資深女性引導年輕世代參與國際事務。培力期間與 WFWP 國際總會會長、WFWP UN 主任/副主任及各洲國際副會長與各國婦女代表連結合作，一起推動婦女權益，並更了解國際總會參與聯合國事務，對聯合國倡議提交 STATEMENT，發揮影響力。</p> <p>會中 WFWP TAIWAN 分享在女力傳承的成果，獲得國際高度關注，提升台灣在國際社群中的能見度與影響力。此外，WFWP TAIWAN 與 WFWP KOREA 確立 2025 年 8 月的合作計畫，韓方將組團來台觀摩學習交流，深化年輕女性的國際參與與培力合作。</p>	
<p>參、計畫實施情形</p>	
<p>一、參加或主辦申請之國際組織會議或活動實施效益、特色及影響：</p> <p>(一)實施效益</p> <p>1.賦權婦女與女孩成為領導者，並具備向地方政府倡議的工具、知識與資源，推動《北京行動綱領》中的和平建設工作。</p> <p>- 認識 1995 年《北京宣言與行動綱領》的重要性，了解其對各國政府與聯合國至今的承諾。</p>	

- 使當地世界婦女和平聯合會 (WFWP) 計畫與《北京行動綱領》接軌，強化作為政府合作夥伴的意識。
- 確認地方在十二項相關領域中優良的實踐模式。
- 通過 WFWP TAIWAN 分享，了解 WFWP TAIWAN 的公私協力合作模式。
- 學習撰寫聲明與正式倡議文件，如 SDGs 地方自願檢視報告 (Voluntary Local Review) 或 CEDAW 影子報告 (Shadow Report)，作為與政府及聯合國合作的範本。
- 認識聯合國婦女地位委員會 (CSW) 政府間論壇，並參與模擬第 69 屆會議，代表各國進行地方與國家議題倡導，最終製作一份參與年度成果文件《協議結論》的制定。

(二) 特色

1.組織文化:重視家庭、關懷、和平與溫暖

BPW 台北天圓分會周郁萍創會會長反饋參與 WFWPI Advocacy Training 真切感受到 WFWP 核心價值在於家庭、關懷、和平與溫暖，與其他團體有很大的不同。

2.學習對聯合國倡議工具及技能:

很深刻體會到 WFWP International 很用心的在安排，有機會與來自世界各地的分會討論將在地計畫與《北京行動綱領》對齊；學習 12 Critical Areas 中的在地優良實踐模式；認識公民社會與政府夥伴合作的運作方式；撰寫倡議聲明與正式文件（如：地方自願檢視報告 (VLR 以對應 SDGs)）。

本次活動的一大亮點，是與會代表有機會模擬參與第 69 屆婦女地位委員會的辯論會議，代表各國發言，實際演練如何就地方與國家層級的優先議題進行倡議，並對年度 CSW 成果文件《共同結論》的形成有所貢獻。與會者均表示這次的培力有相當的高度與內涵，特別在國家自願檢視報告 VNR Review (Voluntary National Review)與地方自願檢視報告 (SDGs Voluntary Local Review) 及模擬 UN 會議等實務演練討論，更了解國際會議的嚴謹程度和流程。

3.多元學習與交流:

年輕女力代表洪欣渝表示，聽到來自許多不同國家女性面臨的問題，以及 WFWP 各地因地制宜所發展出來的方案以解決當地婦女議題。

(三)影響

1.對組織: WFWP TAIWAN 連續三年實體參與 WFWPI TRAINING，在國際參與實務上有更豐富的經驗，特別是在聯合國倡議的專業技能的精進，並增進與國際總會、WFWP UN NEW YORK OFFICE 及 WFWP UN GENEVA OFFICE 主任與專員及各國會長幹部之間的連結，也促進實體合作交流計畫的達成。WFWP TAIWAN

的在地服務方案經驗可以分享貢獻給國際社會，也增強 WFWP TAIWAN 將服務專業化的決心與信心。

組織也將於今年年會的工作成果報告將培力所學運用，撰寫 SDGs VLR，作為與政府及聯合國合作對接的連結溝通基礎。

2.對參與個人而言:拓展個人的國際視野，多元豐富的文化視角，引發更強烈的國際參與連結的行動力與執行力。

(四)返臺後目標

WFWP TAIWAN 回國後，除了通過實體會議及線上官網與媒體報導宣傳報告紐約行國際參與的收穫，更希望後續與政府與民間組織，無論是深耕在地服務或是國際參與，努力積極創造更多合作交流的機遇，引響更多在地婦團與 NGO 將在地深耕的成果與國際交流分享。

(一) 爭取或維護該國際組織會籍情形(請於 250 字內要述)

是。世界和平婦女會台灣總會自 1992 年創會以來持續維持積極參與及貢獻於國際總會之線上年會，同時每年組團參加三月於紐約舉辦之國際培力活動；同時每年繳交國際會費 200 美金，維持在 WFWP 國際組織會籍身分，為各國公認之積極活躍的分會。同時以創會精神理念深耕台灣在地之公益服務婦女權益促進，包括：校園青少年愛滋菸檳毒品防制、婦女培力與幸福家庭教育、年輕女力國際參與培力及中高齡婦女樂活不老學苑，和在地政府長年合作，持續推展在地服務和努力創造臺灣和國際連接的平臺。提供了良好的服務典範及方案經驗，分享給國際總會和各國分會。

(二) 爭取擔任該國際組織主要幹部情形(請於 250 字內要述)

WFWP TAIWAN 故理事長林理俐曾任亞洲區會長(2019 年辭世)。本會於 2019 年創立 GWEPA 全球女企業家和平聯盟，組織委員會，積極培力傳承女性人繼續參與國際事務，為培養可以擔任國際總會之主要幹部而努力，例如：接任亞洲區域會長或秘書長之人才，積極參與國際年會報告擔任講座發表者，以及在國際總會七大委員會擔任委員或觀察員，及到 WFWP 國際總會紐約、日內瓦、維也納擔任實習生。2025 年 WFWP Taiwan 團隊由趙文瑜副理事長於國際培力中報告台灣服務方案的成效。台大王麗容名譽教授受邀報告「政府與公民社會夥伴關係：世界婦女和平會台灣總會最佳實踐案例」。

(三) 爭取該國際組織重要年會在臺主辦情形(請於 250 字內要述)

WFWP TAIWAN 不僅深耕在地服務，且積極提供年輕女力國際參與和交流機會。通過 3/10 與國際會長與紐約辦公室主任及韓國秘書長的討論餐會中，國際總會與紐約辦公室主任一致肯定台灣代表團的國際參與力，並希望 2026 年能有更多女力參與。同時，因各國看見台灣女力培力成果，引起國際各國關注，WFWP KOREA 將於 2025 年 8 月組團到臺灣進行台韓女力交流及觀摩 WFWP TAIWAN 培力進行，未來將參考 WFWP TAIWAN 模式在韓國發展，屆時將邀請 WFWP JAPAN 或 ASIA 其他國家一起與台灣女力進行國際交流和學習，台灣

也將通過此機會培養國際人才團隊，為爭取未來年會及更多國際活動在台舉辦。

(四) 其他設定目標及達成情形(請於 250 字內要述)

WFWP Taiwan 展現女性領導力與國際參與力。今年共有 10 位代表參與 Advocacy Training，包括副理事長、理監事們與年輕女力，於培訓中踴躍發言、參與，深獲國際總會及各國分會高度肯定，彰顯台灣女性於國際舞台上的影響力。趙文瑜副理事長與王麗容教授參與 CSW69 及 WFWPI CSW Side Event，儘管台灣在國際政治中處境敏感，仍獲得兩個正式名額，展現了國際總會對 WFWP Taiwan 的重視。3 月 14 日，與國際總會長、紐約辦公室主任、韓國秘書長等代表深入交流，拓展合作契機；15 日續與各國 NGO 青年領袖於紐約參訪交流。3 月 16 日拜會美國全球和平華人聯合會會長 Amy Young，討論未來合作與交流的可能性。

二、 大眾傳播媒體及社會人士之反應或評價(請於 250 字內要述)

在 WFWP TAIWAN 官網、官方 LINE、FB、IG 發佈年輕女力參與國際事務的宣傳，並且在 4 月 8 日的理監事會議上報告了這次去的成果及收穫。理監事和會員們也紛紛表示支持並希望在未來有機會參與，一起協助國民外交和 WFWP Taiwan 國際事務的推動，深化國際倡議力，啟發行動視野，提升實務技能，跨國交流。

趙文瑜副理事長返臺之後，在臺灣大學演講時宣傳了 2025 年 5 月 3 日 NGO CSW69 年輕女性國際參與分享講座-人生不受限:挑戰自我。參與的年輕女力郭于璇本身經營自媒體，並把參與的心得和圖片分享至[個人的 IG](#)，友人紛紛給予此活動很大的肯定。

肆、 綜合檢討或改進建議：(請於 500 字內要述)

整體活動在課程規劃、議題深度與國際交流方面受到高度肯定，認為課程實用且啟發性強，尤其在理解聯合國體系、女性賦權及模擬聯合國會議方面獲益良多。

1. BPW 台北天圓分會周郁萍創會長建議對於專業議題如 VNR (國家自願檢視報告) 事前提供更多背景說明與架構，協助參與者快速掌握核心概念與討論脈絡，並於討論中提供紙本或電子檔個案資料，有助於促進理解與討論深度。雖然培訓前有作業要完成，但因時間緣故，建議 WFWP TAIWAN 可以舉辦培訓前線上說明會。此外，課程涵蓋知識量大，時間緊湊，雖有分組討論與經驗交流時間，但時間仍嫌不足，建議未來適度調整，增加互動環節，有更多彼此分享觀點與實務經驗。
2. 年輕女力代表郭于嫵提到在教學方式方面，除傳統講授與模擬會議外，可考慮導入 Slido、Kahoot 等互動工具，提升學員參與度與課堂活力。
3. 因在國際舞臺上讓各國看見台灣的服務成果是一件很寶貴且重要的機會，WFWPI Advocacy Training 會安排各國代表報告和發表時間，未來會議前需準備更完整的服務成果英文版，讓國際總會和各國分會更加瞭解。
