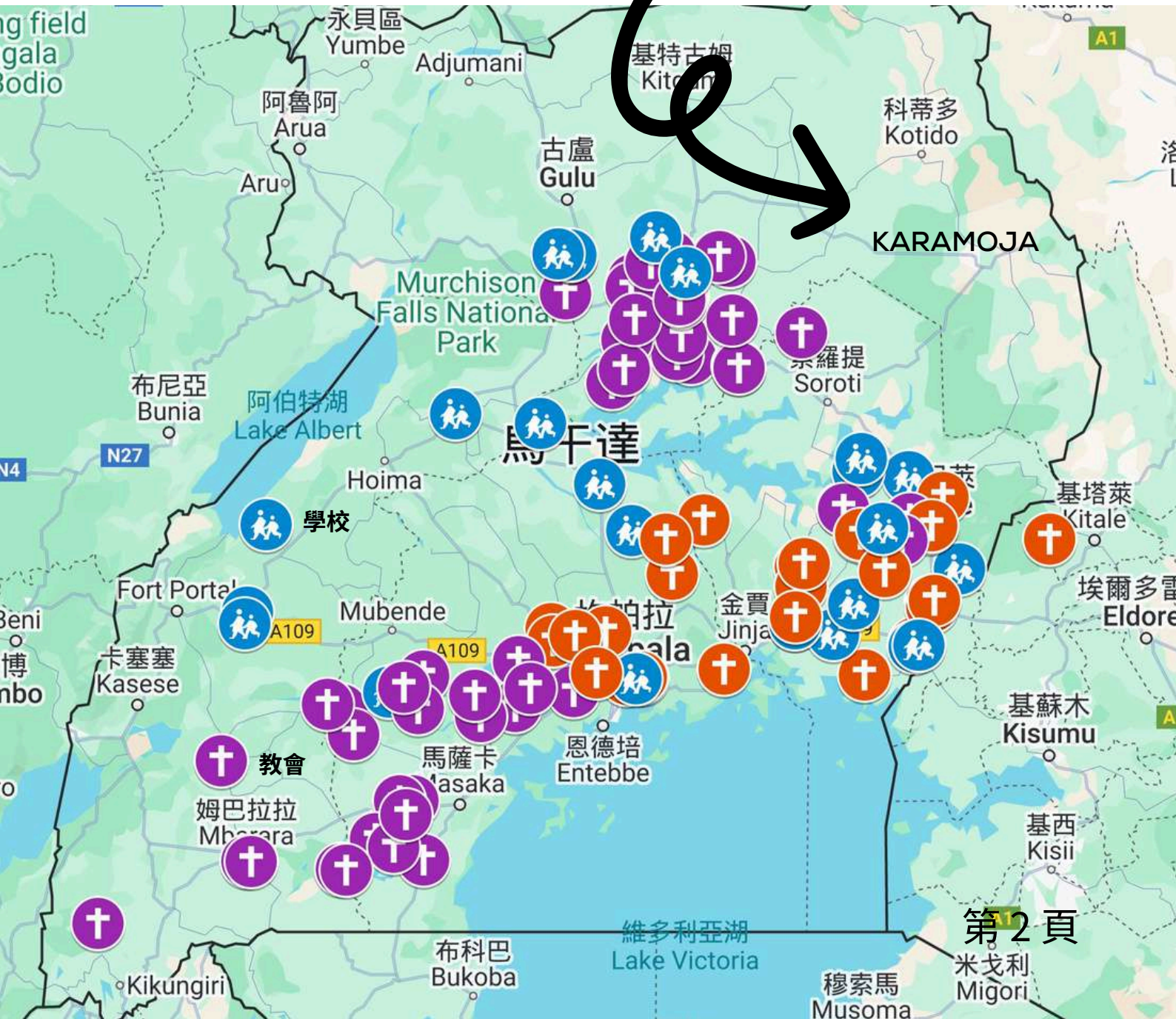

On 24th September, the LBI team trained two schools: Mpunge Seed Secondary with 112 students, and Mpunge Primary with 134 students. A total of 246 students were trained. Today, they will be teaching in three schools.

Pad trainings preparations are ongoing. So far material cutting is done. We will be having a workshop next week in Mukono and 8 schools confirmed will be trained, expected number of beneficiaries is 1099 if all goes well

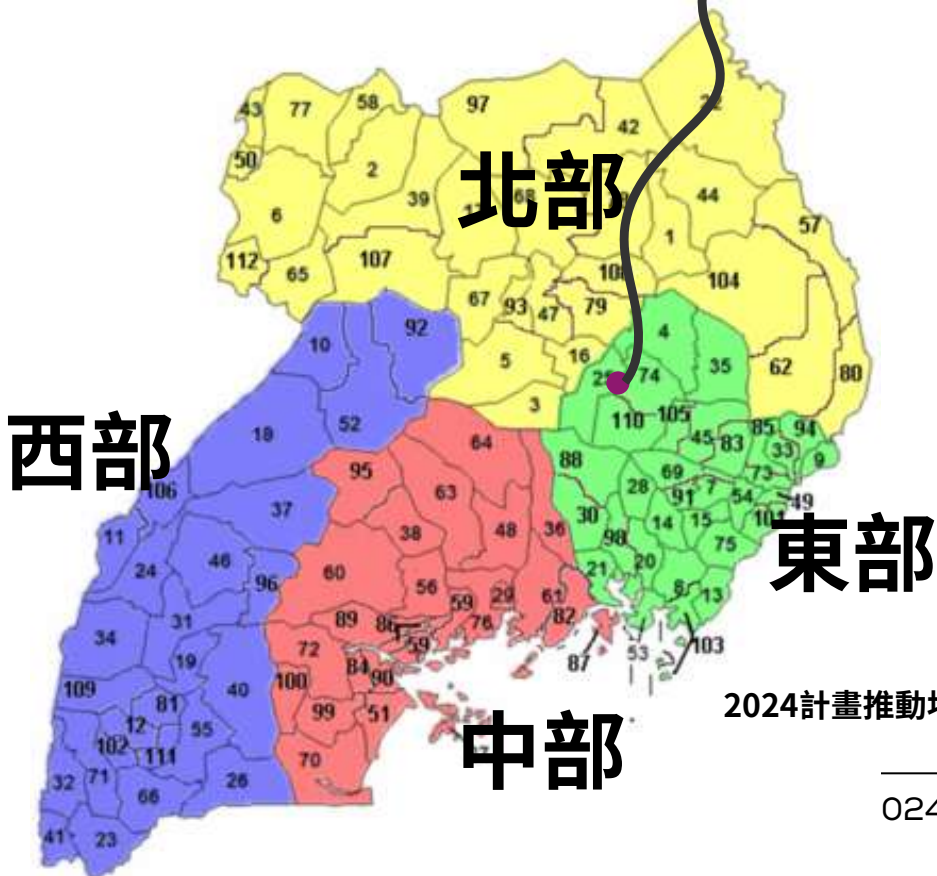
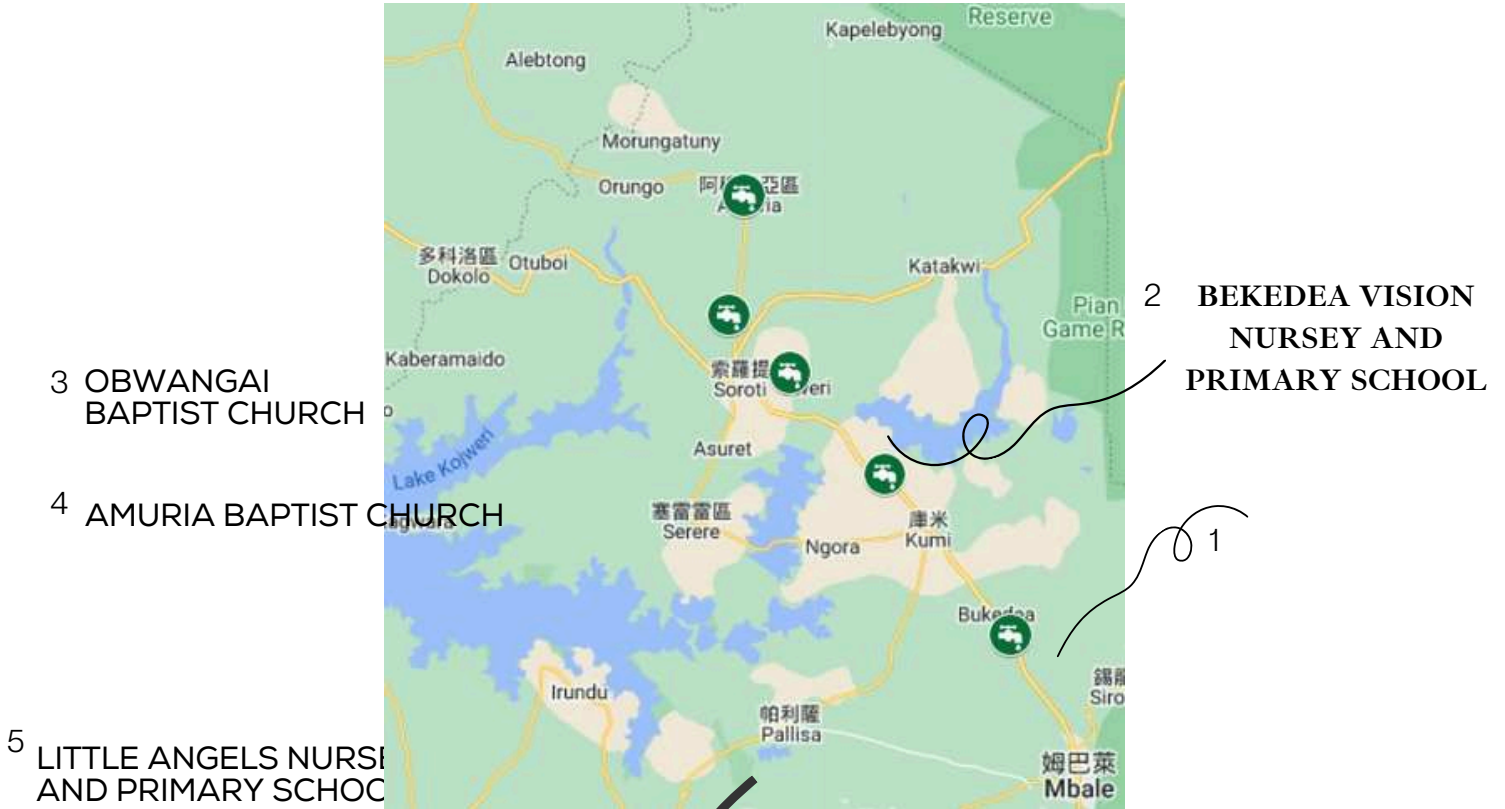

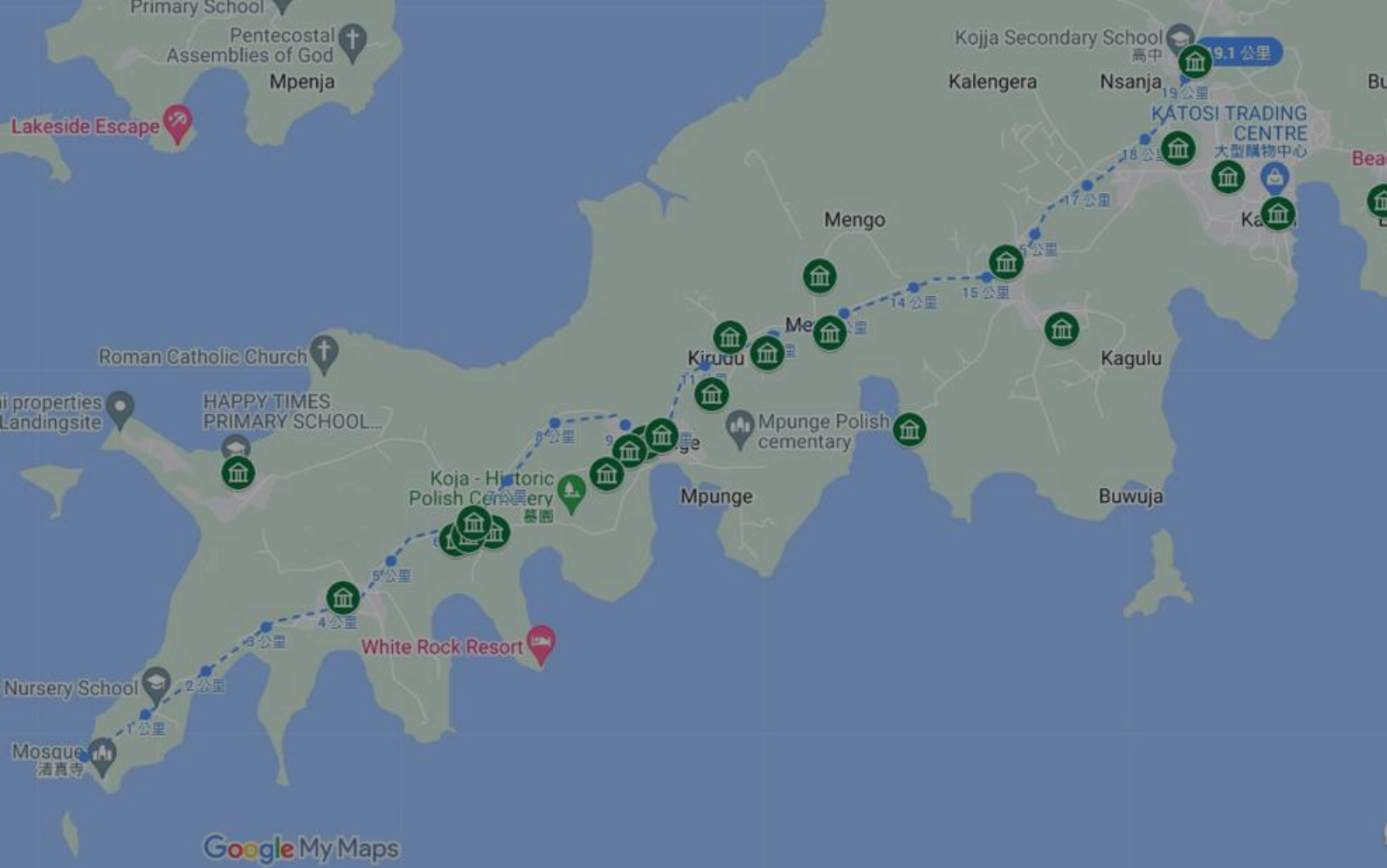

Fear and low self-esteem hinder

Barriers. Ms Susan Abello opens up about challenges she faced, attributing the low self-esteem she had, to her slum upbringing. She also shares that she always had a passion for leadership but she was too shy to take up posts.

Susan Abello is the Country Manager of Love Binti International. The story of where she was born and started her life, to where she is right now is one of interesting twists and turns, one that she is happy to share as she looks back gratefully at how far she has come.

Ms Abello who proudly identifies herself as a slum girl was raised in the slums of Kampala and studied at the Police Children's School in Nsambya for her primary education. Thereafter she went to Kibibi Secondary School in Mpigi for six years.

In secondary school, Ms Abello managed to secure a leadership position at her Senior Three where she served as the assistant health prefect. She wanted to become a class leader but unfortunately, self-doubt, low self-esteem, and shyness got the better part of her, which she would later in life overcome.

Following this, she pursued a Bachelor's Degree in Library and Information Science from Makerere University and later initiated a Master's Degree in IT, which after three years of toiling, she was unable to complete.

Early career life

Ms Abello's early career life was kick-started by a stranger she met on the bus while on her way to her upcountry home, Soroti, after her undergraduate degree. A quick chat bus with the stranger next to her seat saw contacts exchanged and a career path started for her as an office messenger.

"I would run around, create banners, cook the tea, deliver different things to would-be clients, and welcome clients among others. When I started creating banners, I thought IT was my thing and that explains the unfinished master's degree," she says.

Forum for Women in Democracy (FOWODE), an organisation that trains women in leadership, management, and administration, skilling them to stand out in society, would become her next home for the next four years.

FOWODE had put out a job advert for a librarian which she applied for and got.

"We were quite many who

attended the interview but I emerged the best and they gave me the job," Abello says.

Within two weeks of her joining, Fowode needed someone to manage their leadership-building programme which she expressed interest in.

"Madam Patricia Munabi the Executive Director of FOWODE, saw it worthy for me to join the leadership camp, so I moved from my role and became a programme assistant for about four years," Ms Abello says.

She shares that the leadership training she received taught her extensive communication skills.

"The training at FOWODE was broad, but my most outstanding one was in communication skills. Before, I was a very shy person, but through that training, I learnt to talk to people when I am looking directly into their eyes when speaking to them and that has taken me far, especially in my decision-making. I make decisions when I am looking at you," she says.

Ms Abello later co-founded Comfort Africa, an organisation dedicated to educating underprivileged children, particularly girls. Through surveys and community engagement, Comfort Africa identified children in need, provided financial support, and addressed basic needs.

The business would later col-

lapse which led her to start a tailoring workshop which has been sustainable up to today and partly contributes towards the expenses of the children she takes care of through Comfort Africa.

Ms Abello's journey as a Country Manager for Love Binti International began when a group of Taiwanese Nationals recognised her impactful work. "Upon seeing what I was doing with the women, children, and tailoring among others, the founders of Love Binti needed someone who would understand their vision and so I got the opportunity to run and manage Love Binti International here in Uganda. I am currently the country manager," Abello says.

Managing a team of around 30 staff members, who are impacting thousands more, she

sees her role as empowering.

"Currently, with Love Binti, we have empowered over 1,600 women in sewing. We run three training centres: two in the slums and one at Makerere University. We get women who are not so academically talented and train them in tailoring, entrepreneurship, and sexual reproductive health among others," Ms Abello says.

She notes that many of women lack the basic knowledge to run their businesses in Uganda which is a big blow to the family system.

"We teach them how to start a business, when to start, how to manage the business and be sustainable," Ms Abello says.

Challenges and opportunities

The 38-year-old opens up about challenges faced, attributing the low self-esteem she had, to her slum upbringing. She also shares that she always had a passion for leadership but she was too shy to take up posts.

"I wanted leadership but my personality would not allow me. I used to be very shy,

I have had to cut down someone's salary because they have been reporting late to office consecutively. That has been very tough for me, but I had to do it to save our staff from adapting the lateness.

What's your favourite meal?

I enjoy a meal of sweet potatoes and peanut batter locally known by some as binyenwa or odi, depending on the community.

What book are you currently reading?

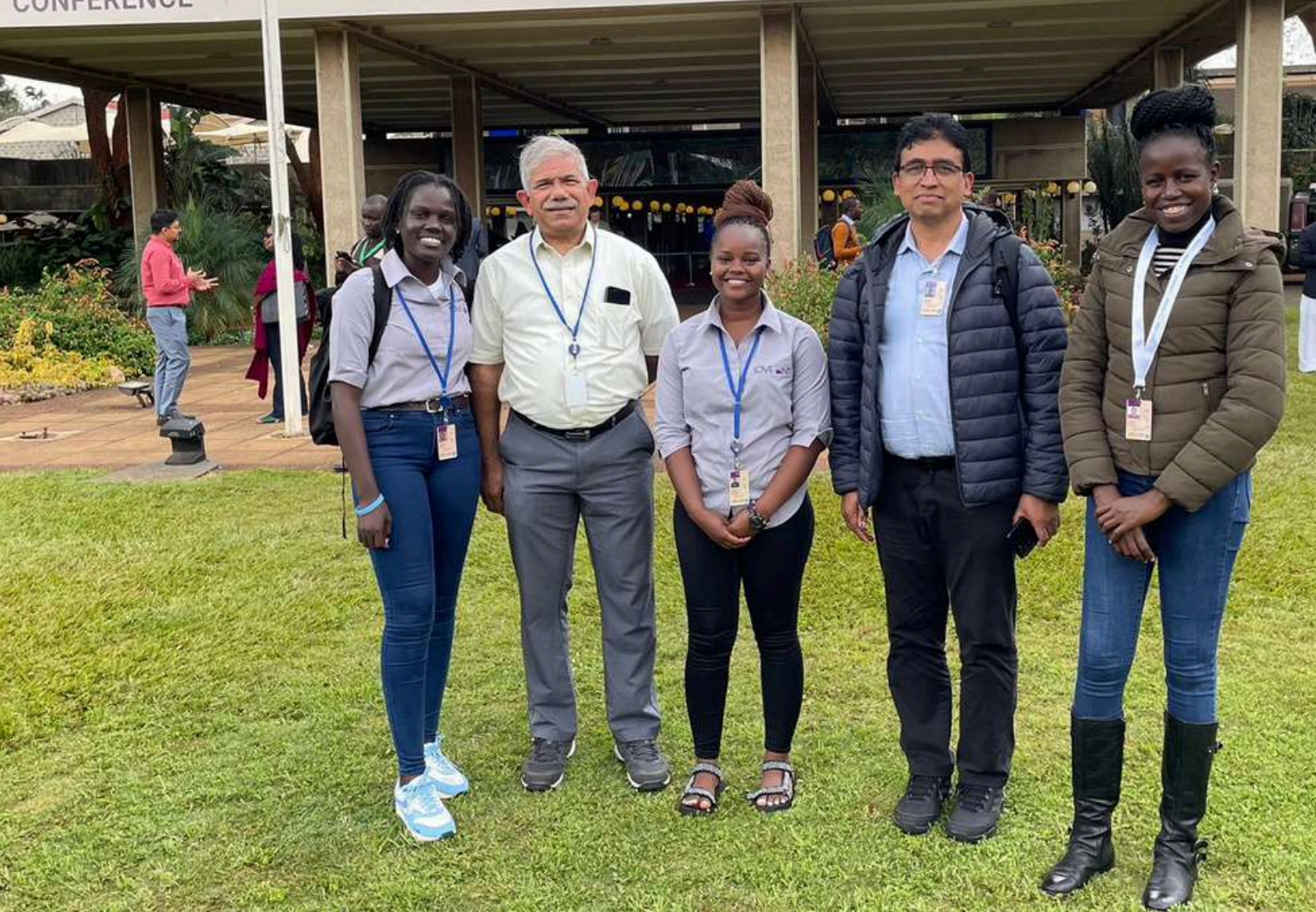
I am currently reading a book titled Smart Villages which is in line with creating sustainable villages.

Love Binti International awarded for its impact in menstrual health hygiene

Menstrual hygiene is a crucial aspect in Uganda, but according to International Rescue Committee (IRC), knowledge about menstrual health hygiene (MHH) is limited as the role of parents passing on basic knowledge and information is minimal.

Other issues around MHH are limited access to information, poor water and sanitation facilities, and minimal access to MHH support. This has left many girls and women in a dire state.

One of the civil society organisations in the fight to improve this situation is Love Binti International through their Menstrual Hygiene Training Programme, which has been at it since 2015. This is through menstrual health education, sustainable pad-making skills, and environmental conservation efforts.

The programme, which began in Kenya with 19 workshops and reached 1,137 girls in its first year,

has now trained over 200,000 young women in Uganda and beyond. This training empowers participants to take control of their menstrual health and helps prevent millions of disposable pads from entering the waste stream contributing to long-term environmental sustainability through training women and adolescent girls how to make their own reusable sanitary towels with fabric.

Owing to their tireless efforts, recently, at AidEX in Geneva, they were rewarded with the SDG Program of the Year Award 2024. The award highlights the community-driven, sustainable approach to addressing period poverty across multiple countries.

This achievement reflects a multi-country effort involving Uganda, the United States, and Taiwan. Together, these partnerships with district local governments, international institutions like the National Taiwan University, as well as organisations like Agape Earth Coalition and the North America Taiwanese Women's Association have demonstrated the power of cross-border collaboration in tack-

MAKING IMPACT

Love Binti International has drilled 53 boreholes in water-scarce areas, providing clean water to over 36,315 households in different parts of Uganda, Eswatini, and South Sudan.

ling one of the most pressing challenges faced by young women and girls.

The programme's impact has been strengthened by youth cross-cultural empowerment initiatives, such as the opportunity provided to one of the project managers, Mr Swalle Excel Kafeero, who was sponsored to study at National Taiwan University.

Mr Kafeero's training brought novel insights and perspectives which were implemented in our projects engendering a greater community impact. Additionally, individuals from Taiwan, including professors, have played an instrumental role in supporting efforts to reduce the effects of period poverty in rural areas of Uganda. They have effectively built the capacity of the Love Binti International team in different spheres including, research, project planning and management, and also nurturing their organic farming acumen that is then shared with rural farmers.

This initiative has enhanced the ability to incorporate global perspectives and best practices into the work, fostering a new generation of leaders equipped to create positive social change.

Other projects Expanding sanitation through bio-toilets in schools

In addition to education, Love Binti International has recognised the critical need for safe sanitation. The organisation has constructed 67 bio-toilets in different Ugandan schools since its first year in 2019,

providing safe and hygienic facilities for girls to manage their menstrual needs.

That year, the Good Samaritan Primary School in Kyaazi, Mukono district and its students were the beneficiary; we have had bio-toilets erected in Ishaka and Mukono districts since then.

Ms Suzan Abello Okae, Project Manager, stated, "Menstrual health goes beyond sanitary products. It is about giving girls the dignity and security to focus on their education. Our bio-toilet projects have created a safer environment, encouraging higher attendance among girls. These toilets can be installed even in the most remote areas and do not require water to maintain cleanliness."

This infrastructure ensures that menstrual health support encompasses hygiene and sustainable long-term access to safe sanitation.

Addressing water scarcity with borehole projects

Access to clean and safe water helps in maintaining hygiene and health while reducing the burden on girls and women who often spend hours collecting water, freeing them to attend school and engage in economic activities.

"This initiative reinforces Love Binti International's commitment to holistic menstrual health solutions by supporting hygiene, health, and sustainable community development," Ms Okae says.

Leading through innovation and community-centred solutions

To ensure sustainability, the CSO uses the community approach. For

instance, through their tailoring workshops, the organisation trains women to produce reusable sanitary pads, creating economic opportunities and supporting menstrual health. To date, 1,400 women have gained sewing and business skills, producing reusable pads that reduce waste and reliance on single-use products, supporting local economies and community resilience.

"We have worked with numerous communities, and recently Love Binti International created a great rapport with communities in Central and Eastern Uganda in Mukono, Kaliro, Namayingo, Nansanga, and Butaleja districts," Ms Okae says.

The government's role

The government of Uganda has also been instrumental in creating an environment that allows NGOs like Love Binti International to operate effectively and make meaningful contributions to the community. Love Binti International has worked within the lines of government parameters and initiated a memorandum of Understanding with every district in which it operates.

Additionally, government entities have been instrumental in providing much needed permits necessary for the organisation to operate. Their support has been crucial in enabling initiatives like this to thrive and expand.

An eye into the future

Winning the SDG Program of the Year Award 2024 is a testament to the collective effort of many hands and hearts from Uganda to the United States, Taiwan, and beyond. With a commitment to keep expanding and refining their reach to more young women, Love Binti International continues to partner with communities and supporters worldwide.

"Together, we are building a world where menstrual health is no barrier to opportunity. We are grateful to all our partners, supporters, and most importantly, the communities who have trusted Love Binti International to walk this journey with them. This award belongs to all of them," Ms Okae says.

2024年，在麥克雷雷大學舉行的畢業典禮上，244 名學生獲得時尚設計普通及高級證書。畢業生呼籲大學將技能課程納入學位教育，因實用技能能有效應對年輕人失業率攀升的問題。

在日趨困難與挑戰中工作，讓我們更明白一個真理：我們的工作不能只追求短暫的救濟，而是要為改變鋪路。我們在愛女孩的努力，不僅是為了幫助，更是希望賦予每個人重拾尊嚴與未來的力量。

我們的核心競爭力，來自這些年累積的點滴心血：

在乾旱的土地上，一口水井不僅帶來清水，還帶來生命的延續。有機農場不僅養活了孩子們，更教會他們如何用自己的雙手改變命運。從農場到水井維護，我們試著用可持續的創新，讓未來有更多可能。

我們從不獨行，我們結合肯亞的牧師、南韓、美國、烏干達的教會，南蘇丹的醫生，這些的長期夥伴一直和我們肩並肩。他們用當地人的視角告訴我們，什麼才是真正的需要；我們用自己的資源，支持他們讓希望延續得更深、更遠。

67口水井，98%依然運作。這背後是無數家庭第一次喝到乾淨水源的喜悅，是孩子們放下水桶拿起書本的未來。數個有機農場的擴展，意味著更多孩子能吃上健康的一餐。每一個數字，都是一個生命的故事。

我們支持芝麻油壓榨、衛生棉製作這樣的小型經濟活動，不只是希望帶來收入，而是教會大家用自己的能力反哺家庭與社區。我們紮根在非洲偏鄉，不僅救急，而是試著教會每個人如何自立，讓幫助持續到下一代。

我們的挑戰是建立組織核心競爭力，成為從「救濟」轉變為「改變」的基石。我們的故事不僅關乎解決問題，更關乎點燃更多人的生命。在此感謝許多朋友的默默的支持，願上帝加添祝福給所有在這個工作的夥伴。
